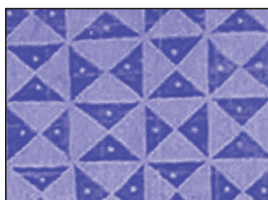
## TRADE BEADS

Students learn about the history of trade beads and their significance in the exploration and colonization of the New World and then make their own trade bead bracelet.



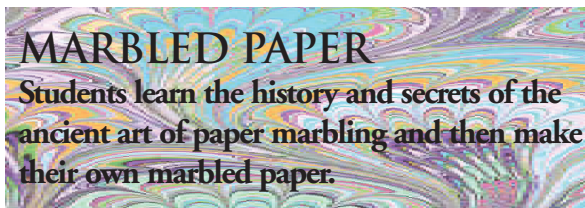
## Quill Pens

Students learn about the history of writing and then make their own quill pens.



## Quilt Squares

Students learn about the designs, symbolism, and historical significance of quilts and then make their own quilt square.



## MARBLED PAPER

Students learn the history and secrets of the ancient art of paper marbling and then make their own marbled paper.
