After years of planning, we opened "Clotilda: The Exhibition" at the Africatown Heritage House in July. Curated in collaboration with descendants and located in the heart of historic Africatown, it tells the story of the 110 men, women and children who came to Mobile aboard the last US slave ship, with a special focus on the remarkable community of Africatown they established. The national acclaim the exhibition has received is a testament to the importance of this story and the resilience of the 110. If you haven't yet visited, please do so soon. It is a moving experience that is not soon forgotten.

Cudjo Lewis, born Kossula/Kossola/Kazoola, was Yoruba and possibly from the town of Banté, in present-day Benin. He was among the 110 captives brought to Mobile aboard the Clotilda in 1860. Later, he was one of the founders of Africatown, where he lived with his wife and fellow shipmate Celia (Abile) and their six children. He was a gifted storyteller, and his moving accounts of his life in West Africa and in Mobile are the subject of Zora Neale Hurston's Barracoon.



Just a few months before, the History Museum hosted "Dressing the Abbey," a blockbuster exhibition of the costumes from the television series *Downton Abbey*. Visitors loved the many scenes created from local antiques, as well as the complementary exhibition of dresses from our own collection.

Equally exciting are the changes happening at Fort Condé, as the living history program begins to take shape. A new staff of living history interpreters bring Colonial Mobile to life through delightful demonstrations and guided tours of the Fort.

At the end of the summer, we said goodbye to our director, Dr. Meg McCrummen Fowler, when her family moved out of state. Her leadership over the last four and a half years profoundly shaped the museum, and she will be missed. Currently, the Board of Directors is conducting the search for a new director who will lead the museum with energy and vision into the next era of growth.

The History Museum of Mobile now operates four sites, each one of them alive with the nuance and texture of the history of Mobile. We are deeply grateful for the robust support of members, visitors, and community partners who help make each of these sites part of the vibrant story of Mobile.

CLOTILDA THE EXHIBITION

AT THE AFRICATOWN HERITAGE HOUSE

GRAND OPENING

After four years of planning, researching, writing, and development, "Clotilda: The Exhibition" opened at the Africatown Heritage House on July 8, 2023 - 156 years to the day after the *Clotilda* brought 110 enslaved African men, women, and children to Mobile.

The exhibition opened to national acclaim. It tells the story from its West African beginnings, through the last voyage, to the founding and establishment of Africatown, and includes some of the artifacts that have been recovered from the shipwreck. Visitors will find a special focus on the people of the story - their individuality, their perseverance, and the extraordinary community they established.

Located in the heart of historic Africatown, Africatown Heritage House is the fourth museum site operated by the History Museum of Mobile.

This blockbuster exhibition showcased 35 costumes from the iconic wardrobe of *Downton Abbey*, one of the most widely watched television dramas in the world.




SPOTLIGHT ON THE COLLECTION

HUBBLE SPACE TELESCOPE

NEW VIEWS FROM THE UNIVERSE

September 29, 2023 - January 7, 2024



Created by NASA, this exhibition immerses visitors in the magnificence and mystery of the Hubble mission and introduces the James Webb Space Telescope. The exhibit features a scale model of the Hubble Space Telescope as well as several "satellite" units. This is a hands-on experience that plunges visitors into the complexities of planets, galaxies, black holes, and other fascinating cosmic entities that have captivated the minds of scientists for centuries.

LIVING HISTORY at COLONIAL FORT CONDÉ

Built on the same site of its 1723 predecessor, this partial reconstruction of Fort Condé offers visitors the chance to learn about Mobile's journey from its beginnings as a French colonial settlement to its early years as an American territory. The Fort is quickly becoming a vibrant living history site, filled with opportunities for visitors to not only learn about colonial Mobile history, but to *experience* it. This past year, four new living history interpreters joined the staff, and their daily demonstrations and weekend tours offer exciting new ways to discover our shared past.









A full calendar of annual events includes Colonial Day, Living History Day, Colonial Eats food festival, Christmas and Mardi Gras wreath making workshops, and Colonial Christmas horse-drawn carriage rides.


