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JUNE LEARNING LUNCH AT THE HISTORY MUSEUM OF MOBILE WILL FEATURE LEE SENTELL, DIRECTOR OF THE ALABAMA TOURISM DEPARTMENT

This month's Learning Lunch Program at the History Museum of Mobile is on Wednesday, June 8, at 12pm and will feature Director of the Alabama Tourism Department, Lee Sentell. He will discuss his book, *The Official U.S. Civil Rights Trail: What Happened Here Changed the World*.

Lee Sentell is among the nation's longest serving state tourism directors, having led Alabama's agency for nearly two decades. He launched the Alabama Civil Rights Trail, the nation's first, in 2004. After tasking a major university to inventory the nation's civil rights landmarks open to the public, he founded the U.S. Civil Rights Trail with his fellow Southern state directors. The trail features more than 120 landmarks in 15 states and Washington D.C. His Alabama agency and Luckie Advertising received the International Travel and Tourism Award for best regional destination marketing in London.

The History Museum of Mobile invites the general public to attend the free Learning Lunch lecture series. Guests are encouraged to bring their lunch and enjoy a presentation on an historical or cultural topic.
